



COVID-19 UPDATE – January 2, 2021

33 Positive Laboratory Confirmations of COVID-19 in the Nass Valley

The Provincial Health Officer (“PHO”) has implemented specific [province-wide restrictions](#) for the holiday season in order that we all may stay safe and prevent the spread of COVID-19. It is expected that all Nass Valley residents adhere to these orders and restrictions. ***These orders remain in effect province-wide until January 8, 2020.***

NVHA COVID-19 Test Results:

NVHA’s Medical Director has provided a second update on the Nass Valley’s current COVID-19 testing and active and recovered cases, current to today’s date below:

This table show tests conducted since the first confirmed cases on December 30th:

There are 3 people currently hospitalized with COVID-19, one of whom are in intensive care, 2 are currently stable but considering a possible transfer to Mill Memorial Hospital.

If you have any COVID-19 symptoms, please contact your local NVHA Health Clinic to get tested and self-isolate as directed by your medical health professionals.

Many family, friends and post-secondary students may naturally have made their way home for the holiday season. It is very important that anyone that came in to the Nass Valley from outside of the Northern Health Region adhere to the PHO’s order for the ***mandatory self-isolation period of 14-days.***





Other important orders include:

- **Wear your masks in all public places and anytime you leave your home.**
- **Remain in your core bubble. Please do not visit family or other people's homes.**
- **Social distance from anyone outside your home and core bubble.**
- **Wash your hands regularly. Use hand sanitizer when you can't.**
- **Essential travel only (work, medical appointments, essential needs)**
- **Avoid large public, or small house gatherings**
