President's Message

Our government has been busy in the last few weeks moving key initiatives forward.

The elected members of the Nation, the Wilp Si'ayuukhl Nisga'a (WSN), ratified an Own Source Revenue (OSR) Amendment Agreement which will considerably reduce the potential OSR attributable to Nisga'a. OSR reduces the amount of the transfer payments we receive from Canada and BC. So entering this agreement will ensure we



retain more funding for our people. Without this agreement, we would have been compelled to either dispute this matter under our Treaty or even possibly litigate this issue in court. So this agreement provides us with a certain outcome, and saves us the costs of litigation. Wherever possible, our preferred approach is negotiation to ensure we obtain what we need as a people, and once again, the benefits of this approach have been borne out by this OSR Agreement. We have what is probably the best OSR agreement negotiated by any aboriginal group in Canada. We will continue to address this issue going forward.

WSN has also approved and adopted the Nisga'a Lisims Government Audited Financial Statements for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016. I'd like to commend our Chief Financial Officer, the Secretary-Treasurer and the Finance Committee for carrying out their responsibilities under our Nisga'a Financial Administration Act. Once again we have demonstrated our accountability and transparency to our people by achieving the highest possible accountability for the funds NLG administers on their behalf. Like all our annual audits, the 2015/16 audit will be available on our website.

In general, Nisga'a citizens have been pleased with the administration of property taxation on Nisga'a Lands. By far, a majority of our Nisga'a citizens have been paying their property taxes. However, some have been very late. So WSN also enacted laws respecting late payment property taxes to provide additional enforcement mechanisms. We of course prefer to avoid taking such measures, but to be fair to all, everyone liable for property tax must address this issue and must do their fair share.

Some of this delay may be due to lack of information of all the available exemptions to which Nisga'a citizens are entitled. They may be unaware that they can apply for taxes — do your people know there is a low income grant. Public education is key for us. There are disability grants. It's up to us to educate our communities. We need our people to explain these things to our citizens. NLG is not going to tax our people indiscriminately. We have ensured that the exemptions that should be in place given the economic realities of our people.

We have also had the media present in our legislature. We are open and accountable. Our guiding philosophy embodied by the

Ayuukhl Nisga'a are the values of dignity and respect. Ours is a unique model of democracy which provides a broad forum to our legislature so our elected members can speak frankly on behalf of their constituents. We hope that the media will be responsible and appreciate this environment and respect its unique characteristics in their reporting, but we shall see.

Respecting our health, as a reminder we will have a health survey for the Nisga'a Nation.

Our legislature has already given direction that we carry out this work to continue to improve our health care. In September the Executive is going to make a decision. This is what sets us apart from many other aboriginal peoples in Canada – we are no longer under the Indian Act.

In 2014, Nisga'a Nation received its last settlement payment under the Treaty. As it presently stands, we may receive our last identified federal transfer from Canada for capital assets under our FFA in 2035. As we've said for years now, we as a Nation must begin planning specifically on the allocation of our revenues how much our taxes will be earmarked for specific purposes.

In respect of continued future funding to our communities, we will never have enough under our fiscal funding agreement (FFA); the only way we will have enough is to provide for ourselves through the establishment of our economy. We will need to consider the needs of all our communities.

In our meetings with the Government, we've been working with Canada on our legislation respecting the environment. We hope that this will take place during the summer.

We have our right of self-government, and we will decide what is in the best interest of our people. It's your decisions that strengthen our mandate.

Our Special Assembly Summary which summarizes the question posed and answers given to our members at Special Assembly has been presented to our Executive and members of the WSN, and will be made available on our website. Some hardcopies will be available at your Village Government and Urban Local Offices.

I want to applaud the work of all the elected representatives. You have given a lot of direction, and that work is constantly being carried out.

In closing, I wish you all a happy and restful summer.

Shaina also likes to take initiative, taking it upon herself with

the support of her family to make application to Miss Canada Globe Productions – a non-profit organization based in Toronto for what Shaina explains is to promote confidence in young women.

As part of her pageantry, Shaina will promote the awareness of cultural appropriation. What is cultural appropriation? While there are varying definitions, to Shaina it is the exploitation of a culture by dominant society. In the context of Indigenous culture in North America, Shaina views the stereotypical "Indian" costumes as false portrayal of the diversity within Indigenous society and endeavors to see such costumes removed from store shelves in Canada.

As we reported in the summer of 2015, Shaina was the lone female with 4 male counterparts that participated in the Nisga'a Museum's intense six week 'Expanding Traditions' art mentorship project where she was mentored by Museum Staff and Senior Nisga'a Carvers Calvin McNeil and Gerald Robinson. Shaina selected the "Woman with Labret" mask from the Ancestor's Collection to study and replicate. Shaina's impressive finished product remains on display at the Nisga'a Museum.

Indeed Shaina is incredibly proud of her Nisga'a culture and can also be seen sitting attentively in the feast hall, or vividly cultural dancing and singing at Hoobiyee and other cultural functions. "My regalia



is not a costume and I want to raise awareness of that" proclaimed Shaina.

The August pageant will also include public participation via online voting in People's Choice awards, so since receiving confirmation that she's been accepted in to the Miss Canada Teen Globe, Shaina hit the ground running promoting her candidacy in various

events such as the annual Salmon Fest cultural dance celebration hosted by Gitmaxmak'ay in Prince Rupert on May 27 and the Seafest parade also in Prince Rupert on June 11. You'll also see her at the Aboriginal Day festivities in Gitlaxt'aamiks on June 17 and in the River Boat Days parade in Terrace in July.

Date: July 6, 2016

The Nisga'a Fisheries and Wildlife Department (NFWD) has been monitoring salmon returns to the Nass River with a combination of catch monitoring in each village, and fish wheel catches in Gitwinksihlkw and Grease Harbour. To date, an estimated 30 percent of the Sockeye run has now passed by the fish wheels at Gitwinksihlkw, giving biologists the information necessary to produce in-season run size estimates.

Unfortunately, the outlook for Sockeye Salmon returning to the Nass River in 2016 looks poor when compared to historical averages. The first in-season estimate projects a **Total Return to Canada (TRTC) of 220, 000 Sockeye, down from a pre-season estimate of 574,000** fish. This may be the result of poor environmental conditions affecting survival of the returning fish. The water levels in 2016 are some of the lowest on record for this time of year and water temperatures are higher than normal. In 2015, similar conditions caused widespread losses of returning salmon in many systems throughout BC and Washington State. In addition, warm ocean conditions may also be affecting the survival of migrating Sockeye. The return of Chinook Salmon to date has been near average, while it is too early to estimate run sizes for Pink, Chum, and Coho.

The NFWD program carefully tracks the runs each year to ensure adequate numbers of salmon reach their spawning grounds (escapement). Using the projected TRTC of 220,000 Sockeye, there are no surplus Sockeye available for commercial or individual sale fisheries (IS). The NFWD regrets to announce that we must postpone any Nass River sale fisheries until further notice, in support of reaching escapement and domestic fishery goals. DFO has also announced the closure of any commercial Sockeye fisheries in Area 3. The NFWD will provide further updates as the season progresses.





If you catch a Sockeye in the Nass River, please check to see if the fish is tagged as follows:



Nass Sockeye are being studied using location transmitters that are inserted into the stomach cavity. Tagged fish can be identified by an external fluorescent green floy tag located behind the dorsal fin and an antenna protruding from the mouth.

If you capture and retain a tagged fish or recover a carcass with a transmitter, please remove the tag and drop off with Nisga'a Fisheries (New Aiyansh), or contact the office at (250) 633-2617 with the following information: location, date, time, and tag ID as written on the external tag.

Be sure to leave contact information for reward receipt purposes!
