



Hli Goothl Wilp-Adokshl Nisga'a – The Nisga'a Museum Continues to Welcome Visitors with Health and Safety Measures in Place

Laxgalts'ap, BC (September 27, 2021) – Hli Goothl Wilp-Adokshl Nisga'a – The Nisga'a Museum will remain open to the public through Thanksgiving Sunday, October 10, 2021 from 10AM to 5PM, Wednesday to Sunday. As a place of learning and reflection, the museum welcomes visitors and community members on Thursday, September 30 for Truth and Reconciliation Day.

To protect visitors and staff from potential exposure to COVID-19, the museum enforces a mask mandate and follows the Provincial Health Order ("PHO") requiring all visitors over the age of 12 to prove their vaccination status upon arrival.

Museum attendees, including those visiting the gift store only, will need to show accepted forms of proof of their vaccination and for those aged 19 and older, a valid piece of Government-issued photo ID upon arrival. According to the PHO, as of September 13, visitors must be partially vaccinated with their first dose of an approved vaccine. Accepted forms of proof vary geographically. The following conditions apply:

- Visitors from BC must present their BC Vaccine Card, digital or print copy. The card can be accessed at <https://www.healthgateway.gov.bc.ca/vaccinecard>.
- Visitors immunized within Canada, outside of BC shall have their Government-issued Vaccine Card, paper or digital and for those aged 19 and older, a valid piece of Government issued photo ID.
- Visitors visiting internationally will need to present the proof of vaccination used to cross the Canadian border and a valid passport.

The Nisga'a Museum expects visitors to respect the governing regulations put in place by the Nisga'a Nation. The museum is designed as an interactive experience with Nisga'a Staff and considers this implementation vital to the health and safety of staff, visitors, families and communities alike. Confrontational conduct by visitors who are vaccinated or unvaccinated and protestors will not be tolerated.
