Welcome to the 2017 Nisga'a Lisims Government Education Conference!

The incredible wisdom of Nisga'a Leadership never ceases to amaze me!

Imagine! The 1913 Petition Nisga'a leadership presentation to the Privy Council of England included education! The importance of education would have been part of leadership discussions since the mid 1850!

"For more than twenty-five years, being convinced that the recognition of our aboriginal rights would be of very great material advantage to us and would open the way for the intellectual, social and industrial advance of our people, we have, in common with other Tribes of British Columbia, actively pressed our claims upon the Governments concerned. In recent years, being more than ever convinced of the advantages to be derived from such recognition and fearing that without such the advance of settlement would endanger our whole future, we have pressed these claims with greatly increased earnestness...

- The above statement was unanimously adopted at a meeting of the Nisgha Nation or Tribe of Indians held at Kincolith on the 22nd day of January, 1913."

I suggest the same leadership aspirations remain true today as Nisga'a Lisims Government continues its support of education through this convention, through Wilp Wilxo'oskwhl Nisga'a, through School District 92 (Nisga'a) and other initiatives. As past Nisga'a Educational leaders reiterated long standing Nisga'a wisdom of past elders,

"Ts'im gan wilaak'ils wil luu sisgihl gandidils" is the philosophical basis for Nisga'a education. Translated literally it means, "within the pursuit of knowledge, therein one will find the true meaning of life." For the Nisga'a, one of the main prerequisites to attaining the aspirations of Indian (Nisga'a) education is the involvement of all the Nisga'a people, children and adults, in the pursuit of quality education. Nisga'a Valley Health Authority

Dear Students/Adults, Parents, Grandparents and Caregivers

The James Samuel Gosnell Memorial Health Centre was designated a hospital under the BC Hospital Act in July 2011. Nisga'a Valley Health Authority (NVHA) provides health services that include Primary care/Physicians, Nursing Services, Public Health, X-rays, Ultrasound, Telemedicine, Specialist services both face to face and telemedicine and health prevention and promotion programs. Primary care services include:

- Supporting people and families to manage chronic disease, like diabetes or high blood pressure
- Supporting people and families to take more active role in their own care
- > Effective user of the expertise of all health care professionals
- Efficiency and coordination in service delivery

NVHA provides excellent physician and nursing services in each of the communities. NVHA employs 4 Nisga'a nurses, 2 from Gingolx and 2 from Gitlaxt'aamiks along with agency nursing. There is a definite need for more Nisga'a nurses. All lab work is done by the nurses, there is a need for X-ray/lab technician. The training is offered in Alberta. Health services staff include:

- 1 X-ray technician and 1 Ultra sound technician from Vancouver.
- > Environmental Health services (EHO) is contracted with FNHA.
- Dental services closed because of increasing costs for travel from Vancouver.
- Home Support and Resident Care is provided by all qualified Nisga'a personnel. The care is given in the home and at each health center.
- ➤ The Community Cultural Health Representatives provide prevention and promotion programs under the supervision of the public health nurse.
- > The mental health and community wellness program includes the:
 - Alcohol Drug counsellors
 - o Nisga'a Crisis Response Team recruit volunteers
 - o Counselling and treatment center referrals
 - The Nisga'a culture/language is implemented in the prevention and promotion programs

NVHA's vision is to improve health outcomes through education, prevention, acute services and research. The Nisga'a nation is welcome to visit the health centers.


